These lines from the Bhagavad Gita's chapter - 2 verse - 47, hold great significance. Bhagavad Gita is not just a book with loads of text but provides solutions and guidance to human's real life problems, equips you to expand the horizon of knowledge and to live a life with contentment, dignity and respect. For me, it speaks of being dedicated to your job, your duties and responsibilities. The Gita helps us to be better, happier version of ourselves, even as we engage in the humdrum activities and experiences of the social world.

The meaning of the verse is -

You have a right to "karma" (actions) but never to any fruits there of. You should never be motivated by the results of your actions, nor should there be any attachment in not doing your prescribed activities.

The above shloka / verse was a message given by Lord Krishna to Arjuna during the Mahabharata, when Arjuna doesn't want to fight against his opponents who are his own relatives. Lord Krishna says to Arjuna, "Your duty is to fight in the war. You don't have to worry about the end result, just perform your duty well and leave the rest to almighty."

Dear students, the deep rooted meaning of the verse is relevant even today for all of us.

Our school logo also reiterates the same message, Trust Thyself' believe in yourself and perform your duties sincerely; success will follow you automatically. You can't control the outcome but you can control your actions, your efforts. When you focus too much on the outcome, you may under perform for the fear of failure.

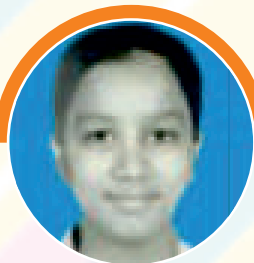

The students dressed up as their favourite teacher and expressed gratitude to one and all.



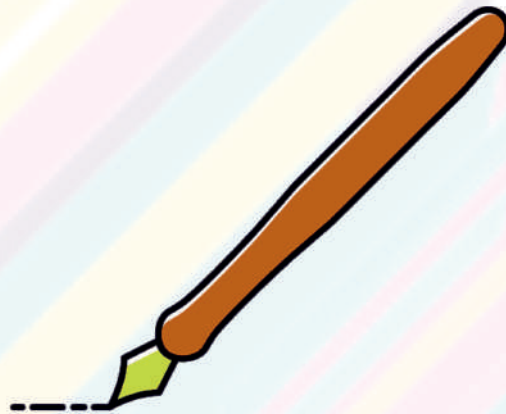


JANAMASHTAMI

Swachhta Pakhwada

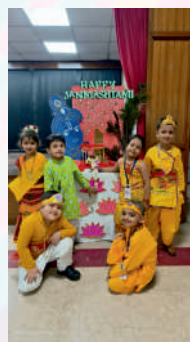
Live Life Cleaner. Make Earth Greener.

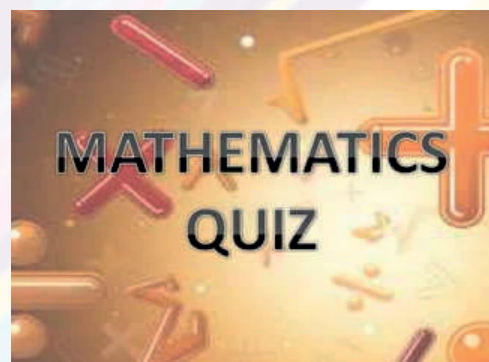

My mother's love will shine like a bright star.

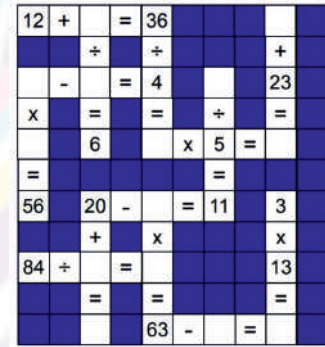

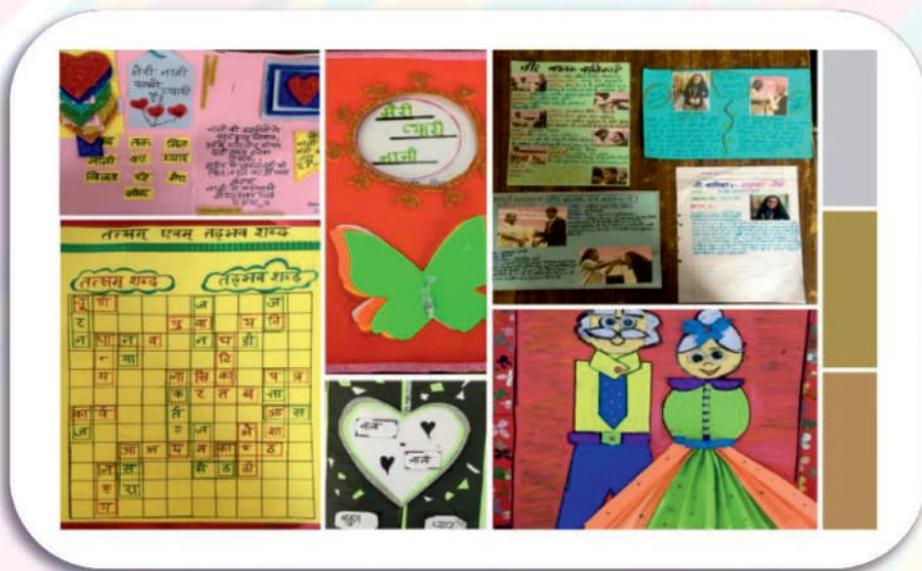

हिंदी भाषा

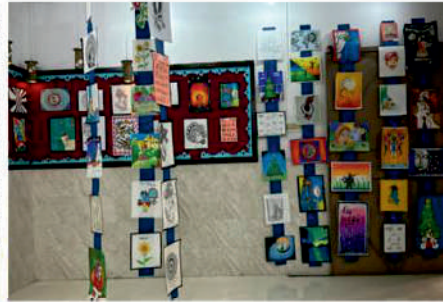
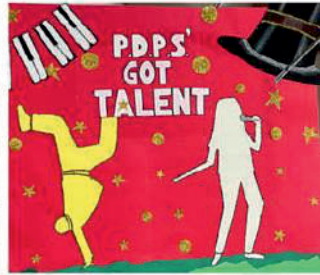
