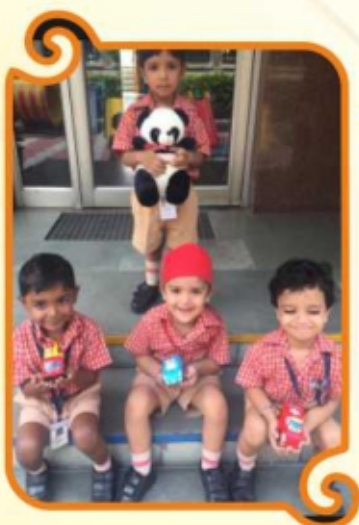
ANIMILIA PARTY

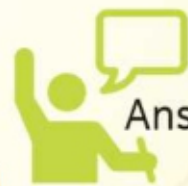

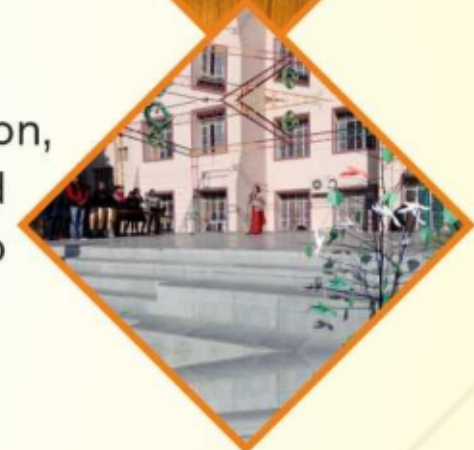
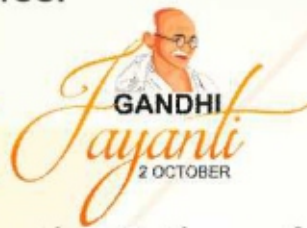
DUSSEHRA

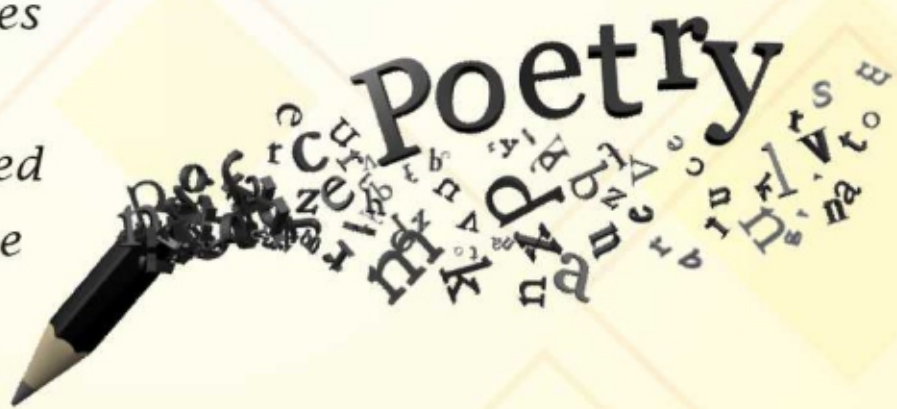
